### Sitting Bull College expands degree offerings

orse whisperers – or dog whisperers – wanted. Or simply anyone with a passion to help animals. A new program being launched at Sitting Bull College (SBC) in Fort Yates will offer an opportunity for students to channel their aptitude with animals into a career. The college is adding a program to train veterinary technicians.

SBC has an approved curriculum and is now seeking a full-time vet tech director and veterinarian instructor as teaching staff before launching the program.

"Once those are staffed, we can start," said Joe Dunn, director of the Agriculture Division at SBC. The goal is to start the program in the fall semester of 2022.

"There's a great demand in the veterinary services industry for veterinarians and vet techs," Dunn said. "When we were originally designing the program, we thought we would move in the direction where our students who complete the program could move into a veterinary science program to get their doctor of veterinary medicine."

Students can also move directly into a job as a vet tech after completing the program.

"I think it's a really good program, because there's such a demand for veterinarians all over the nation," Dunn said. "There's a lot of interest from the local community, because we're in farm-and-ranch country and people are hands-on and like animals."

The program will offer an associate degree as a veterinarian technician in approximately two years.

"There's been interest in a veterinary program here for some time. A couple of years ago, we did a survey of high school seniors here on Standing Rock and the surrounding

area and we came up with about an 85% positivity rate for demand for that program," Dunn said.

Classes range from intro to vet technology, to anatomy, physiology and microbiology to diagnostic imaging to care for small, large and exotic animals, for a total of 91 credits.

Curriculum was approved last spring and is designed to apply for accreditation from the American Veterinary Medical Association, Dunn said.

The college plans to start construction this spring of a facility for the Agriculture Division to support the program. The new ag center will be a 40x90 facility with two classroom spaces, office spaces and a shop. It will house ag personnel and provide classroom and lab space for the vet tech program.

This fall, SBC collaborated with the Rural Veterinary Experience Teaching and Service (RVETS), which is a nonprofit headquartered out of Dixon, Calif., to provide a five-day equine clinic at the SBC arena by Prairie Knights Casino Sept. 28-Oct. 2.

Dr. Tarek Isham, DVM; Dr. Jaimie White, DVM; and Dr. Betsy Lordan, DVM, CJF; delivered equine veterinary services and a three-day farrier clinic. SBC students assisted

with castrations, dental floats, hoof trims and other medical procedures. Lordan provided farrier presentations and discussion, along with hands-on training. Participants learned basic hoof trimming and horseshoeing techniques during the farrier clinic.

RVETS provides services to underserved rural communities in the United States and abroad, and has brought equine services to the community annually. One of the vets also helped develop the curriculum for the vet tech program.

"We have been providing veterinary care workshops throughout the year to try to maintain interest in the program," Dunn said.

RVETS is open to anyone with an interest.

"Anyone that has any interest can come and learn," he said. This fall, about 50 horses were brought to the event.

"The workshop itself is a community service," he said, and will help promote the vet tech program until the classes begin.

# Mor-Gran-Sou's annual meeting scheduled for July 15, 2022

re you looking for a way to serve the people of central southwestern North Dakota? Look no further, as Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative can help you fulfill that desire. Why not serve as a board director for the cooperative? The initial commitment is a three-year term, with provisions in the bylaws limiting a director to serving six consecutive three-year terms, after which time the director is not eligible for another six consecutive three-year terms until one year has elapsed.

At the annual meeting, the following three board positions will be elected:

- The Grant County position presently held by Vern Frederick;
- The Mandan area position presently held by Pam Geiger; and
- The Morton County position presently held by Jay Larson.

Under the bylaws and due to the use of a mail-in ballot, no nominations are accepted from the floor at the annual meeting. Instead, the bylaws require the board of directors to appoint a Nominating Committee of five to nine members who geographically represent the cooperative. These members will provide a list of qualified and willing candidates to the board for approval and inclusion on the ballot at the board of directors' meeting scheduled for March 23, 2022. This date has been set so there is adequate time for each candidate's biographical information to be included with the notice of meeting sent to the members in June, along with the mail-in ballot for those who are unable to attend the annual meeting in-person.

The Nominating Committee has been appointed by the board and will meet for the first time, set for Jan. 11, 2022. The members of the Nominating Committee include Jennifer Bonogofsky, St. Anthony; Jackie Buckley, Mandan; Rosie Erhardt, Mandan; Curtis Feland, Almont; Glenda Gross, Selfridge; Garek Murphy, Fort Yates; Jim Neubauer, Mandan; Donald D. Roth, New Leipzig; and Yvonne Seidler, New Leipzig.

For a person to be nominated, the member vying for a board seat must submit the completed declaration of candidacy form to Mor-Gran-Sou by 4 p.m. CT (3 p.m. MT) on Thursday, March 10, 2022. The completed form must be mailed to Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative, Attn: Julie Armijo, P.O. Box 297, Flasher, ND, 58535-0297.

#### Bylaws and resolutions for the annual meeting

Under the bylaws, any bylaw amendments or resolutions must be presented to the members in writing in advance of the annual meeting scheduled for July 15, 2022. The board of directors has charged the Nominating Committee with reviewing and advising the board of any proposed bylaw amendments and resolutions. Therefore, any proposed bylaw amendments and resolutions should be submitted in writing no later than March 15, 2022, and/or they can be presented in-person at one of the following in-person meetings of the Nominating Committee:

We feel it's important to help finance our local students' educational journeys by offering scholarships to qualifying seniors. We continue to offer more scholarship opportunities to our graduating seniors. The applicants must be dependents of Mor-Gran-Sou members. All scholarships will be awarded during the 2021-22 school year.

The co-op will award nine \$500 scholarships to qualified applicants whose parent(s) or guardian(s) are members of the co-op. School representatives from Elgin-New Leipzig Public School, Flasher Public School, Glen Ullin Public School, Hebron Public School, Mandan Public School, New Salem-Almont Public School, Selfridge Public School, Standing Rock Community School and Solen Public School will select one graduating senior to receive the funds.

Interested in applying? Students should contact their school counselor for deadline information. The schools will then forward each recipient's name to Mor-Gran-Sou.

#### **Basin Electric Power Cooperative scholarship:**
