

Buckley awarded Agriculturalist of the Year

or-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative member Jackie Buckley was recently honored as the 96th Agriculturalist of the Year and was added to the Hall of Fame by the North Dakota State University (NDSU) Saddle and Sirloin Club.

Buckley has been involved in almost every component of agriculture, making an impact wherever she went.

"Jackie has been a huge influence in the lives of agriculturists of all ages, including myself," said Brooke Kunz, a Saddle and Sirloin Club member. "It is truly an honor to know Jackie and to be a part of her journey as Agriculturist of the Year. I nominated Jackie, because she has influenced my passion for agriculture from a young age through 4-H and she continues furthering her influence on the lives of so many today."

Buckley grew up on a registered Hereford farm/ranch operation in western North Dakota near Belfield, where she was the oldest of five girls.

"Since I was the oldest, I helped my dad a lot with the operation," Buckley said. She was her dad's hired hand, raking hay, combining, and checking cows and calves. Buckley was also active in 4-H, showing steers and heifers at local and state fairs.

Buckley attended NDSU, majoring in animal science and minoring in food nutrition and ag communications. She graduated in the spring of 1979 and got a job as an NDSU Extension agent. She worked in Traill, Bowman and Morton counties for a total of 37 years. A majority of the time was spent in Morton County.

At the time she began, she was one of the only females in the industry.

"She paved a way for females in the Extension and agriculture industry, and that is a huge reason why she is so deserving of this honor," Kunz said.

Buckley's leadership goes beyond Extension. She has been involved and held leadership roles in numerous organizations in North Dakota. She was a member of the Morton County Weed Board, Bismarck/Mandan Ag Chamber Committee, Morton County Crop Improvement Association, *North Dakota Living* Ag Classroom Committee and a coach to the Morton County 4-H and Mandan FFA livestock judging teams. These positions are only a fraction of the list.

Buckley has led the efforts with the KFYR Living Ag Classroom for 25 years. Each year, this event brings 1,200 fourth-graders to the Bismarck Event Center to learn about where their food comes from.

Buckley has retired from Extension work. She is serving as a Morton County commissioner and teaching Animal Science 114 Lab at Bismarck State College to stay connected with agriculture and people. ■

Safety Starts with ME: Wayde Eckroth

ayde Eckroth grew up on his family ranch near Flasher. He enjoys hunting, fishing and the great outdoors. He is also a lineworker for Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative.

One of the things Eckroth loves best about North Dakota, and Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative's service territory, is the natural beauty that surrounds us.

"We are fortunate to have so many trees that offer shade and a habitat for all sorts of birds and other wildlife," Eckroth said.

"As a member of the local community, and a lineman at Mor-Gran-Sou, we strive to balance maintaining beautiful surroundings and ensuring a reliable power supply by keeping power lines clear in rights of way," Eckroth said.

Overgrown vegetation and trees pose

a risk to power lines. For example, if trees are touching power lines in our members' yards, they can pose grave danger to families. If children can access those trees, they can potentially climb into a danger zone. Electricity can arc, or jump, from a power line to a nearby conductor like a tree.

"First and foremost, we care about our members and put their safety and that of my co-workers and line workers above all else," Eckroth said.

A proactive approach also diminishes the chances of fallen branches or trees during severe weather that makes it more complicated and dangerous for lineworkers to restore power.

Of course, one of the biggest benefits of a smart vegetation management program is reliability. Strategic tree trimming reduces the frequency of downed lines causing power outages.



Members can help by:

- Planting new trees and vegetation away from the power lines and pad-mount transformers, avoiding future issues.
- Call the co-op if you notice that you have vegetation growing near the power lines. ■

RDFC announces 2022 grant opportunities

he Rural Development Finance Corporation (RDFC) has approved a 2022 grant allotment of \$2,000 on behalf of Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative to be used to support community-owned entities, nonprofits and community-based projects.

Eligible projects: Community-owned businesses (café, grocery store, motel, other); community facilities (ambulance services, fire districts, recreation, hospital/clinic, community center, other); or community-based projects (school/youth projects, other) that benefit rural areas and lead to community betterment. Please note the RDFC does not provide funds for medical fundraisers or general operating costs.

Matching funds: \$4 of other funds to every \$1 of RDFC funds. The member cooperative is responsible for verifying the matching funds. The matching funds DO NOT need to come from the utility cooperative.

Maximum/minimum grant amounts: The minimum

grant amount is \$500; the maximum is \$2,000. The limit is \$2,000 on behalf of Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative for 2022.

Timeframe: Now through Dec. 31

Process: Call Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative at 701-663-0297, 701-597-3301 or 800-750-8212, or email info@morgransou.com, to visit about a specific project and determine eligibility. If it meets the qualifications, the member should complete an application and submit for consideration.

From there, the application will be presented to the board of directors for approval. If approved, the grant application will be submitted to RDFC for final consideration. The RDFC board gives final approval on grant requests. Once approved, a check will be made out to the recipient entity listed on the application and mailed to the contact person listed on the application. ■
