Mor-Gran-Sou announces candidates seeking board of director positions


Mandan Area:

Scheduling payments with SmartHub

embers are now able to schedule their electric bill payments using SmartHub. This new feature allows members the option of scheduling their payment in advance.

"In the past, we have had members ask for a payment schedule feature and now, we are able to accommodate that need," says Jackie Miller, Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative's manager of member services. "With the busy schedules in today's world, members like to make payments for all their household bills at one time."


Members are allowed to schedule a payment up to 20 days in advance. To schedule a payment, members will need to log on to SmartHub using the mobile app or through Mor-Gran-Sou's website, www.morgransou.com. If you choose to pay through the website, click on "My Account" (upper right-hand corner of the home page) or Your Account (blue bar on the home page)/SmartHub/and click the link "Log in to SmartHub or to create an account." Once you have entered your email address and password, your account is in focus. Select the "Make"

Payment" button that will take you to the Payment Summary screen, and then select the "Continue" button.

This screen (see graphic below) allows you to select the payment method and date to schedule a payment. After a payment is scheduled, members receive a confirmation email or message confirming the pending transaction. If you pay through the SmartHub mobile app, choose "Bill & Pay," and select the "Pay" button. This next screen allows the member to schedule a payment.

It is important to note that scheduling a payment is not considered a payment arrangement, as the software does not notify the office staff of a member's scheduled payments. Mor-Gran-Sou receives the payment on the date selected by the members and it will be applied to their account. All bills are due the 20th of every month. Services may be subject to late fees or a disconnection of electric service if the payment is received after the due date.

As mentioned, a scheduled payment is not a payment arrangement. If a member needs to make a payment arrangement, we ask that you contact the office and speak to a customer service representative. The mysterious gravesite of 'Ray Coop'


Recently, we decided it was time to tie up the 4-H steers for the first time at our place. Now, anybody who undertakes that task remembers how much of a project it can be the first time — especially since we waited until the steers weighed more than 800 pounds.

The steers are in the feedlot at Grandpa and Grandma Renner's ranch near St. Anthony. Our 10-year-old son, Stran, and 8-year-old daughter, Stray, didn't want to stick around the barn for the excitement, so they went out to venture around the place, something they have often done before.

After the successful halter application and attachment to a sturdy pole in the barn, my wife Sheila and I sat down to watch. Soon the kids returned to the barn.

That's when Stray asked Sheila, "Why is there a guy buried in Grandpa and Grandma's yard?" She continued, "There's a pole with the name 'Ray Coop' on it with some numbers underneath."

She led us over to the supposed "burial place" and what we found was one of the funniest things we have seen in a long time. Stray was right about a few things: There is a pole with a name and numbers on it. However, it stood for something quite different. What was on the pole was "REA CO-OP," which many of you know stands for Rural Electric Association Cooperative, not "Ray Coop," an unknown man buried in Grandpa and Grandma Renner's yard!
