Eckroth earns journeyman status

Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative Lineman Wayde Eckroth has graduated from the Apprenticeship Training and Safety (AT&S) lineworker program administered by the North Dakota Association of Rural Electric Cooperatives.

Hired in January 2012, Eckroth works with Joe Michael in Flasher and the surrounding communities to build and maintain the co-op's electrical system.

As a graduate of the AT&S program, Eckroth has logged 8,000 hours of supervised training on poles, tower and construction; line hardware and framing; overhead conductors; tools and equipment; transformers; oil circuit reclosers,



regulators and capacitors; metering and instrument transformers; rolling stock; engineering; records; safety meetings; hot-line maintenance; troubleshooting; underground; substations; lighting; and service.

Since graduation, Eckroth has experienced an increase in duties and expectations at Mor-Gran-Sou. He says he feels comfortable with the tasks, thanks to his education and on-the-job training. He's also come to know the co-op's member-owners and service area better over the years.

Keeping our electric system as reliable as possible

Tree trimming is a regular part of your electric cooperative's operations. Mor-Gran-Sou, like all electric utilities, is required to maintain appropriate clearance between trees and electric transmission and distribution lines. Trees need to be trimmed, and in some cases removed, to minimize potential power outages and to eliminate fire and safety hazards due to trees contacting energized electric lines.

Mor-Gran-Sou typically uses local contract tree-trimming crews to perform this task. Bullinger Tree Trimming will have crews operating within our service area again this year.

Please know that they are working on your cooperative's behalf to help keep our electric system as reliable and safe as possible.

Idle services to be retired

Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative continues to retire idle services that are not making any payment to the cooperative, but continue to receive regular maintenance. Our procedure is to post a detailed list in our communications material to keep members informed of idle services that will be retired. This is the second notice of this particular group of idle services to be retired.

Co-op personnel have already contacted, or tried to contact, the property owner and affected property owners based on the information available. If someone is willing to pay the line retention fee, we no longer consider it an idle service. If no one comes forward, the line is put on a list and will be retired.
