Grant helps pantry volunteers give people food, dignity

The shelves and freezer at the Carson Food Pantry were well-stocked the first week in October. Just days before, the pantry was nearly empty, and volunteers were digging into their own pockets to buy food for area residents who rely on the donations to get by.

Located on Main Street in Carson, the pantry used to be open once a month, but the time was extended to once every six weeks because there wasn't enough money to replenish the goods on the shelves.

"We serve more than 70 families some days, and when they come, they need it," says volunteer Trisha Zimmerman.

In October, the pantry was full, thanks in great part to an Operation Round Up grant bestowed by the Charitable Trust, on behalf of participating Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative members.

2020 Electric Cooperative Youth Tour

Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative will sponsor another ambitious student on the 2020 Electric Cooperative Youth Tour trip to Washington, D.C.

From June 20 to 26, students nationwide will spend a week learning about history and American government; visiting with their state's congressional delegation; becoming more knowledgeable about the cooperative business model; and touring museums, national monuments and memorials. They will also develop leadership skills and a national network of peers.

To earn the trip, students must enter an essay-writing contest. To qualify, the winning student must be a sophomore or junior in high school, and his or her family or guardian must receive electric service from Mor-Gran-Sou.
