Winter driving safety

Compromised roads can lead to accidents. Be aware of electrical hazards you may encounter on the road.

If you are driving after a storm, stay away from downed power lines, poles and related equipment. Do not assume it is de-energized. Call 911 immediately to report the damage and protect the public. If you know the system is Mor-Gran-Sou's, call 701-663-0297, 701-597-3301 or 800-750-8212.

If you are in a car accident with a power pole, do not leave the vehicle until professional personnel tell you it is safe to exit. If the car is in contact with a power pole or line, it could be energized. Stepping outside could be deadly if your body becomes the path to ground for electricity. Remain inside and call 911, and wait for utility personnel to arrive and ensure the line is de-energized.
